## Crystal's Unique Seahorse Logo — A Visual Reflection of Elegance at Sea

*When the founders of Crystal Cruises Inc. sought an appropriate visual representation for its newly created cruise line, they called upon San Francisco's internationally renowned design firm of Walter Landor Associates to create an original and definitive logo.*

Awarded the challenge of establishing a unique emblem for the new company, the talented Landor designers came up with several concepts to depict the crucial elements of Crystal Cruises' original mission statement and ultimate goal: to offer its seagoing clientele the world's most luxurious cruise vacation ever.

The key words were luxury and elegance. The essential feeling was one of beauty. The element of the sea was as important as it was obvious.

In 1988, Landor Associates created and the Crystal executives chose what has since become one of the cruise industry's most unique and striking logos. The clean and simple design included two facing symmetrical seahorses, those mythical, legendary, stately servants of the sea gods Neptune and Poseidon. The sleek, unique creations of marine nature move most elegantly and seemingly effortlessly through the earth's oceans — exactly what Crystal Cruises hoped to achieve with the launch of its luxurious new ships.



### The Royal Touch, The Visual Pun

Adding the royal touch of a five-pointed crown at the seahorses' heads suggested Crystal's rise to regal status in the cruise industry, a position it achieved almost immediately after Crystal Harmony's launch in 1990, and which it still

maintains 20 years later, after the introduction of Crystal Symphony in 1995 and Crystal Serenity in 2003.

An unprecedented addition to and feature of the logo was the novel use of the

"negative" space in the area formed between the seahorses. The "white space" between the graceful creatures forms an image of a whale's tail, yet another beautiful symbol of the ocean's magnificence.

The concept of using the "visual pun" in a logo was new in the '80s. Landor's clever creation of the whale's tail logo-within-the-logo was a forerunner to the most recent example — the white arrow formed by the space between the "E" and the "x" in the modernized FedEx logo. If you haven't yet noticed the arrow

While it often appears in black and white — or "reversed" white and black in certain applications — Crystal Cruises' logo is most properly seen in its specially chosen contemporary teal color, known in the printing industry by its special Pantone Matching System number 321.

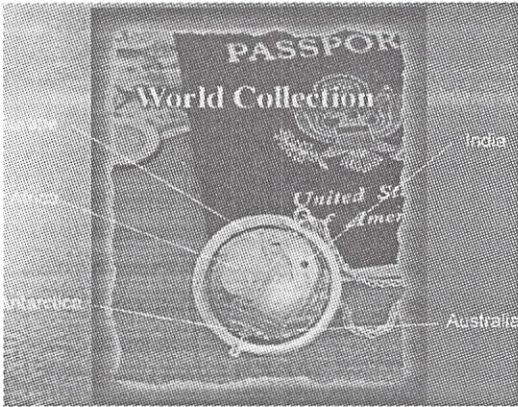

## Personal Items Reminder

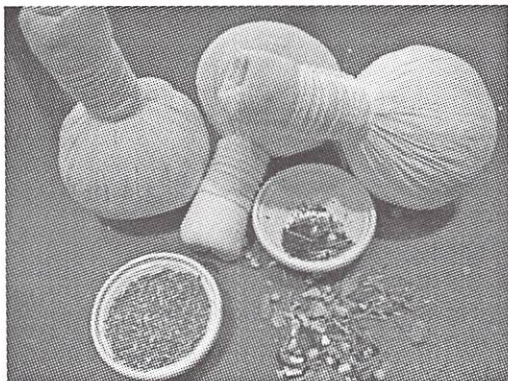

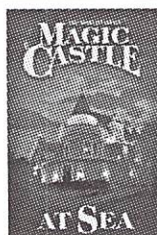

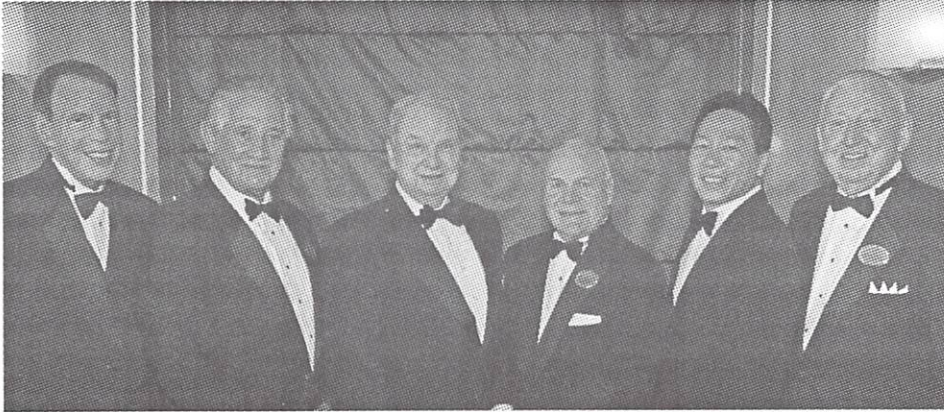

## MEET OUR AMBASSADOR HOSTS

**Fred Makler** was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. When he was two years old, his parents moved to St. Louis, MO. He graduated from University City High School in University City, MO with honors. He then attended the University of Missouri in Columbia, MO where he received his Bachelors degree with a double major in Spanish and Education. He later went on to receive his Masters degree in Spanish with a concentration on Mexican literature.

Fred taught Spanish at the high school and university level for many years. During this time he took numerous trips to Mexico, Puerto Rico, Colombia, Costa Rica, and Venezuela. In June of 2000, he visited Cuba for the first time on a special grant for teachers called Cuba for Educators. Fred has also worked as a translator assisting couples wishing to adopt children from Latin America. He has been a student, tour guide, and interpreter and is equally conversant in Spanish and English.

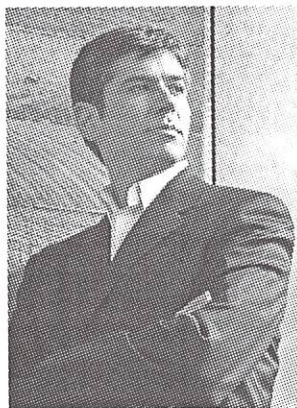
